HOA Dues/Late Fees. Monthly HOA fee is due on the 1st of the month. Late fee of \$35.00 will be assessed for any payments made after the 20th of the month. Our Property Manager provides a portal where we can set up an automated payment. There are several convenient ways to pay.

HOA Fees

As with mostly everything, expenses are going up! The Board of Directors is working hard collecting bids and negotiating for services in 2023. We are all disappointed to see that our monthly maintenance fee must be increased by 5% in order to sustain services.

The monthly fee will be increased to \$308 beginning January 2023. Be assured that the board is constantly working to keep costs under control. However, with inflation running between 8 and 10%, and our ACTUAL maintenance, landscaping and other fees going up between 15-25%, a 5% increase will not come close to meeting our increased costs. Fiscal responsibility and maintenance continue to be our priority. We are working very hard to be as creative as we can be to try and cover these inflated costs, which are not likely to go down even if inflation does. Our primary goal is always to avoid special assessments in the future. Maintaining our community leads to stable property values and attractive appearance.

Landscaping reminders

The HOA policy states that owners are responsible for any landscaping within a ten foot perimeter of their unit. In the past, the HOA provided these services which increased expenses considerably. It is now necessary that we enforce the owner's responsibility for their 10' perimeter, including flower beds, trees, and mulching.

As stated in the HOA Policies Guide:

Building Maintenance, Repair, Landscaping Responsibilities

13. Landscaping: Owners are responsible for landscaping within the 10-foot area around the perimeter of their condominium, to include all mulching and shrub/plant care. Damages to a unit caused by trees or plants within the 10-foot perimeter of a unit are the responsibility of the owner of that unit. The association will, however, be responsible for shrubbery trimming and removal of dead plants within this area.
